Welcome!

Dear ladies and gentlemen, colleagues and gardening friends

The 2025 growing season treated us to a particularly flavourful and high-quality tomato harvest – both indoors and outdoors. Rarely has the fruit quality of our outdoor tomatoes been as good as this year!

After a bumpy start due to unusually late frosts (until May 20th) and a subsequent, albeit short, but intense drought in the spring, the rain sometimes came at just the right time, or sometimes not at all.

Following the dry spell in spring, heavy rain with resulting soil compaction, and a correspondingly high weed pressure initially shaped the growing season.

However, the weather improved during the main harvest period, and what began so mixed became more and more enjoyable week by week, often accompanied by pleasant temperatures. An early frost at the beginning of October then brought the harvest season to a somewhat shorter end than we had experienced in previous years.

Overall, the crops performed well and those that didn't, were evenly balanced, and we can look back on a moderately positive year for vegetables and seeds, although we unfortunately can't compare to the reports from the potato and fruit harvests.

Through our work and our varieties we aim to deliver delicious results in the garden and field, helping you continue to enjoy the rewards of gardening.

We hope you enjoy reading this and wish you much success for the coming season. Enjoy!

Partnership with Bioverita for “Organic right from the start”

Culinaris has been an official member of the bioverita association since 2023. On the one hand, Bioverita serves as a platform for organic breeders in Europe and promotes their networking. On the other hand, the association provides information about the need for organic breeding through projects, events and public relations work. The association certifies varieties from organic or biodynamic breeding that are optimally adapted to the conditions of organic farming. To achieve this, all stages of breeding work must be carried out on organic farms. Genetic modification techniques are of course excluded and compliance is ensured through auditing and regular controls. Home gardeners and commercial growers can benefit from Bioverita varieties because of their health, robustness and resistance to fungal diseases, as well as their ability to reproduce vegetables, grains and fruit. At the same time, more and more people are enjoying resistant seed varieties that are more resilient to climate change, but also have good taste and high nutritional quality. The breeding of new tomato varieties usually takes around 9 generations, which in summer crops means years. After years of dedicated work, we are thrilled to introduce the first tomato varieties from our own breeding programme, designed specifically for cultivation in greenhouses and polytunnels. These varieties have been carefully selected for soil-based systems under organic growing conditions. Our focus has been on achieving exceptional taste and high fruit quality while ensuring reliable and impressive yields. Equally important, we prioritised plant health throughout the breeding process.

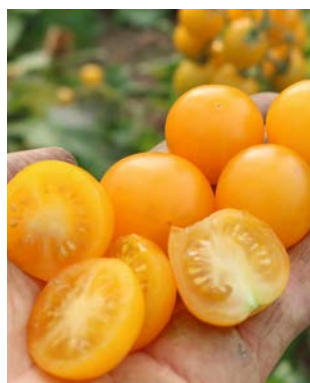


Salad Tomato **811-x³**
Fruit weight: 60g

An early-maturing salad tomato with a classic, well-coloured red hue. The fruits are relatively firm, flattened-round, and have a balanced aroma with an intense tomato flavour. The trusses are usually divided and compact, and harvesting with the calyx attached is possible. The plants have medium vigour and healthy, erect foliage. This variety is suitable for both home gardens and commercial cultivation. 811-x is resistant to tomato mosaic virus (TomMV) and robust against tomato leaf mould (Ff).

Cocktail Tomato **Su-9004³**
Fruit weight: 20g

Su-9004 is an exceptionally aromatic and sweet cocktail tomato. It produces masses of bright yellow fruit on divided trusses. Thanks to its relatively open foliage and minimal suckering, cultivation and harvesting are quite pleasant and quick. The fruit ripens early, and the yield is high for the fruit size. This variety is recommended for both home gardens and commercial cultivation.



Cocktail Tomato **Prigobello (772-FL-x)**
Fruit weight: 25g

Introducing a classic “Gardeners Delight” type cherry tomato! Slightly stocky growth habit with short internodes (good for low tunnels and home gardens). Above-average heat-resistant plants and fruits. Very profitable. The proportion of marketable fruit is also very high. The tasty, bright red fruits hang on long panicles, are early ripening and very resistant to bursting. The plants have good resistance to tomato leaf mould (Ff).

Salad Tomato **Blicello** (819-x)

Fruit weight: 50g

Midi tomato, with round, pink fruits on compact, often divided trusses.

Vine harvesting is possible. Plants are healthy, open, and vigorous, featuring long internodes and beautiful dark green foliage.

For layer cultivation, the clusters should be shortened as the lowest fruits on each cluster ripen more slowly. This variety offers exceptionally high yields, and the fruits are deliciously fruity. To prevent splitting, it is important to maintain consistent watering.



Salad Tomato **Zebrago** (786-x)

Fruit weight: 60g

Beautiful (slightly ribbed) yellow-greenish striped fruits, which ripen to golden yellow. Strong-growing, narrow plants with slightly drooping dark green foliage. Panicle usually undivided, very productive and early ripening. A little softer when fully ripe, but still stores well. During storage, small brown dots appear after a few days. These are characteristic of the variety and do not affect consumption. The aroma is exceptionally complex with a balanced acidity-sweetness ratio and spicy-fruity components.



Salad Tomato **Retillo** (820-x)

Fruit weight: 70g

Salad tomato with round, red, well-coloured fruits and very attractive sepals on compact, mostly undivided trusses. The fruit are extremely firm, with a balanced and fruity taste. Harvesting with sepals is possible. Very healthy, narrow plants with good growth and drooping foliage. High yield potential. Ripening is medium early. The variety has good field resistance to disease.

NEW IN GERMANY: Grow tomatoes outdoors without training! For the first time, there are varieties for simplified cultivation to improve the supply even in winter.

With the participation of many colleagues from amateur and commercial horticulture, plant production, research and advisory services, these varieties were organically bred and approved in the open field.¹ The high-yielding new varieties are characterised by improved field resistance to late blight without compromising fruit quality. They also perform well with reduced fertilisation and irrigation.

The new bush tomato varieties have been tested very successfully, particularly for cultivation in Community Supported Agriculture (CSA), with the option of processing them into passata, tomato paste, or preserved whole fruits for winter storage. Drying in a professional facility was also successful. For large-scale field cultivation, it is best to establish a range of sales channels, including the fresh market.

Cultivation on straw mulch is recommended to keep the fruits dry and clean.

Preventing damage from mice and slugs is also advised. The main harvest takes place in August and September.

- in beds: 60-120cm (in the row) x 100-150 cm (between rows) depending on soil type and water supply,
- in raised beds | Plant/m² and
- in pots at least 10 Litre size.

Bush Tomato **Gutingi**³

Fruit weight: 50g

Gutingi is the most important variety for large-scale cultivation due to its size, similar to a salad tomato.



Bush Tomato **Vivaoro** (B11)³

Fruit weight: 30g

The bush tomato variety Vivaoro produces golden-yellow cocktail tomatoes with a sweet-tart flavour and an exciting aroma. A real eye-catcher for many uses! Its bushy growth and dense foliage make it the most suitable variety for growing in containers.





Bush Tomato **Vivarossa**

Fruit weight: 25g

The bush tomato variety Vivarossa produces red cocktail tomatoes. When processed into preserves, the combination with Vivaoro looks particularly attractive. The plant develops longer shoots with rather loose foliage.

Outdoor-Cordon Tomatoes

With the varieties Primabella, Resibella and Rondobella there is now a range whose split-resistant fruits (compared to other outdoor varieties) store well and are therefore ideal for direct marketing.



Candy Primabella

Fruit weight: 30g

Aromatic cocktail tomato with a good balance of sweet and sour. The crisp red fruits hang in beautiful trusses. Mid-season ripening. Very robust and vigorous plant with dark green foliage. Compact seedlings.



Resibella

Fruit weight: 50g

Resibella is a salad tomato. This variety has an intense tomato flavour and a good balanced taste (even after cold nights), with good yields outside. The classic red fruits are juicy, outstanding for fresh consumption and snacking. Early ripening, vigorous variety. Strong-growing seedlings.



Rondobella

Fruit weight: 100g

Rondobella is a large salad tomato with an exceptionally fruity taste and intense tomato flavour. The round red fruits are relatively firm and therefore ideal for salads and cooking. The tomatoes are hanging on small trusses with 4-6 fruits. Early to mid-season ripening. The variety is vigorous. Strong-growing seedlings.



We have placed these three new varieties under the Open Source Seed Licence. Anyone may freely use open-source seed - that is, grow, propagate, develop it further and use it for breeding. No one, however, may privatise the seed and its developments - the licence excludes patent and plant variety protection.²

Sunviva was the first tomato with this licence. We now have also licenced Vivaroma and Vivagrande to drive the initiative forward. Have fun with them!



The First **Sunviva**

Fruit weight: 20g

Sunviva has bright yellow fruits, is particularly juicy and has a strong, fruity aroma. Suitable for snacking, for decorating salads and as an ingredient in various vegetable dishes. Very robust and suitable for multi-stemmed training. Very precocious. Strong-growing seedlings.



Vivaroma

Fruit weight: 50g

Classic red, juicy salad tomato with an exceptionally intense tomato flavour and a pleasantly thin skin. Excellent for both salads and fresh use. Early to mid-season ripening. Medium vigour and foliage density. Medium-sized, vigorous seedlings. Compared to the other new outdoor varieties Vivaroma has low Phytophthora resistance. In humid conditions best grown under cover.

The enormous **Vivagrande**

Fruit weight: 200g

Classic red beef tomato for cooking or in sandwiches. Mid-season ripening. Very robust, low-growing plant with medium foliage density. Compact, strong young seedlings.

Classic red **Primavera**

Fruit weight: 25g

Luminous, red-orange fruit that melt in the mouth.

Especially juicy and fruity-sweet.

Early ripening.

Robust, mid-sized plant with average foliage density.

Strong, compact seedlings.



Classic yellow **Dorada**

Fruit weight: 25g

Irresistible golden-yellow fruit, resistant to cracking.

Especially juicy and fruity-sweet.

Early ripening.

Robust, mid-sized plant with average foliage density.

Strong, compact seedlings.



This one's got bite! **Clou**

Fruit weight: 35g

Crisp, juicy yellow fruit with mild, pleasantly tart flavour.

Great multi-purpose fruit.

Early ripening.

Healthy plant with loose foliage, potato-leaf type.

Large, strong seedlings.



Resi For several years now, Resi has been the standout variety in all of our long-term field trials. It has also been admitted to the EU catalogue as an amateur variety.



The Standout **Resi**

Fruit weight 20g

Generous, dark green foliage and a slender stature give this plant a certain ornamental flair. Though yields of Resi's aromatic, scarlet fruit can be slightly less plentiful than other varieties, the length of the harvest makes up for it. Very robust. Compact transplants.





The adolescent **Moltorello** (631-FL)
Fruit weight: 95g

Heart-shaped tomato with very healthy fruits that are particularly suitable for cooking due to their slightly spicy notes, but can of course also be eaten raw. Semi-determinate plant with only 2 leaves between each panicle. This results in a compact growth and is very suitable for low greenhouse structures, such as those often found in home gardens.

*Also ideal for pot cultivation with tomato stakes. Resistant to early blight (*Alternaria solani*) and good resistance to late blight, but not as strong field resistance as our new outdoor varieties, which is why the plants should be protected from rain.*

Wild Tomatoes

(Lycopersicon pimpinellifolium)

These are pretty close to the original tomato! Dainty, with boundless energy to grow, the best of their kind also boast the following qualities:

- Robustness (as long as there is plenty of airflow and sun)
 - Low fertilizer and water needs
 - Generous amounts of fruit
 - Great for children
 - Can be grown creatively as an ornamental feature, for e.g. in buckets on the balcony.
- Not suitable for training as cordons!



Rote Marmor (Red marble)

Fruit weight 2g

Blushing pinky-red, soft, and sweet, these tiny fruits are calling out to be snacked on.

Very compact, vigorous seedlings.

Higher temperature needed during germination!



Golden Currant

Fruit weight: 6g

Sweet, cherry-sized fruit are a joy for big and small!

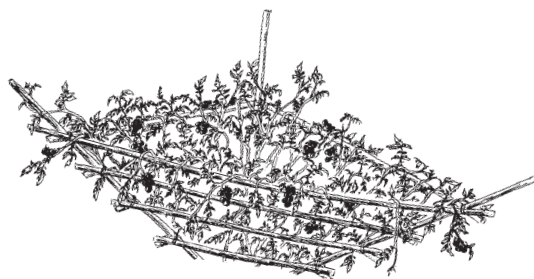
Very compact, vigorous seedlings.



Cultivation method:

Wild tomatoes need plenty of space to spread. They are at their best beside a fence, wall, or along a path. Arrange bamboo stakes as supports in the home garden, or use the "Göttingen System" (see picture) for the market garden.

These varieties have withstood the test of time in a number of locations, under distinct growing conditions, not only outdoors. They're a standard hit in the home garden - we recommend a mix.



The High Fliers **Cerise Gelb** (Cerise yellow)

Fruit weight: 20g

Vigorous and robust plant with curling leaves typical of the variety. Harvest period for this mild, juicy cocktail tomato is notably long.



Cerise Rot (Cerise Red)

Fruit weight: 25g

Vigorous and robust plant with curling leaves typical of the variety. Harvest period for this mild, juicy cocktail tomato is notably long.

Red Teardrop **Celsior**

Fruit weight: 12g

This mid-size plant bears extraordinary cocktail tomatoes. Best yields occur during the second half of the season. Great taste and beautiful firm, juicy consistency - a perfect addition for the fall.



The Tried and Tested **Matina**

Fruit weight: 60g

Matina is a reliable stand out with lovely potato-leaf foliage and bountiful yields. Thanks to prompt ripening, good early season yields can be expected. Further yields are weather-dependent. Classic salad tomato, sweet and juicy.





The Italian **De Berao**

Fruit weight: 80g

Robust plants with elongated, oval red fruit. A great cooking tomato, perfect for soups, sauces, ketchups, and anything else that will preserve this tomato's flavour for the winter.



The Newbie **Zorarot** (Rote Zora)

Fruit weight: 100g

This tomato mixes things up with its sumptuous, elongated raspberry-red fruit, and elegant, pinnate leaves. Beautiful in the garden and on the plate. Mild, aromatic flavor, perfect for salads and cooking.



The Pink-Red **Capseya** (Pepper-shaped)

Fruit weight: 200g

This variety's diminutive growth habit does nothing to slow down the bountiful production of heavy, ribbed fruit. Early-season harvests are very reliable, late-season harvests strongly weather-dependent. Mild and aromatic. Also well suited for growing under cover, and therefore popular with market gardeners wanting to expand their heirloom collection

We recommend growing these vibrant heritage varieties in the greenhouse, and as cordons. We grow these tomatoes in field under a small cover with limited fertilizer and no irrigation, and selected them based on their high performance, robust health, and outstanding flavour.



Slivowidnij

Fruit weight: 10g

Fan-like inflorescences bear masses of succulent, oval yellow fruit. Sweet and slightly tart, these are the perfect snacking choice. Generous growth habit, also does nicely in planters. Harvest whole branches of unripe fruit before a frost and hang them indoors to ripen.



Zitronentraube (Lemon Drop)

Fruit weight: 20g

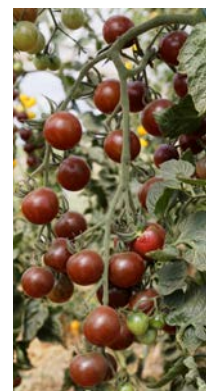
Lemon Drop's numerous lemon-yellow ribbed oval fruit grow on generous plants and boast a pleasing acidity. The flowers' scent is reminiscent of lemons. High yielding even later on in the season. Ripening begins mid-season. Average growth habit with succulent, bright green plants.



Black Cherry

Fruit weight: 23g

Cocktail tomato with a wonderful fragrance and lovely, soft flesh. Transparent skin and purple-red flesh. Vigorous growth habit. A winner in the market garden.





Weißer Pfirsich (White peach)

Fruit weight: 50g

Covered in a light peachy fuzz, this tomato ranges in colour from creamy white to yellow with a mild, fruity flavor and extraordinarily soft skin. White Peach yields large numbers of delicious fruit even in cooler areas. Plants are slender and strong with few suckers and relatively light foliage.



Auriga

Fruit weight: 65g

Orange fruit that appears lit up from the inside. Sweet and sour fruity flavour and firm skin. A lovely salad tomato. Average growth habit.



Zebranelle Fruit weight: 25g

Red-green striped tomato with dark red flesh inside. The fruits are extremely sweet with a good, slightly spicy aroma, are very firm, can be stored well and can linger on the plant for a surprisingly long time, even when fully ripe. It is also ideal as a dried tomato. The plants have medium vigour, are very slender, healthy and have lush, dark foliage. Moderate to low production of side-shoots. The variety makes beautiful, compact young plants.

Green Zebra

Fruit weight: 120g

Glowing fruit are mottled bright green and yellow when ripe.

A great salad tomato with mild acidity and full aroma.

Compact plants with average growth.

A great variety for the market garden.



Mandarine

Fruit weight: 150g

A stand-out thanks to its pleasant sweetness and low acidity, coupled with an unusually fruity aroma. Great fruit quality and soft skin make it a joy to eat. Ripens mid-season. Average growth habit.



Black Plum

Fruit weight: 45g

Squat, oval fruit with elegant dark red flesh are predestined for sauces, soups, or pastes. Also do nicely in salads.

Strong, robust plants.



Paul Robson

Fruit weight: 105g

A dark red salad tomato with soft flesh and a unique, captivating aroma.

Vigorous growth habit with loose foliage.

A great variety for the market garden.



In trials, we tested many larger fruiting beef tomatoes particularly for their suitability in terms of fruit health and quality, taste and endurance. Colour, shape and other unique selling points were also included in the selection criteria. Cultivation was carried out under low-input conditions. The following varieties were convincing:



Ananori

Fruit weight: 200g

Ananori is an older beef tomato with excellent taste and exceptional looks. The thin skin and high fruit weight make it better for short transport routes and fresh consumption. The plant has a low to medium vigour, only moderately side-shooting and has strong green foliage. The fruits are flat, slightly-ribbed and have a green to yellow-red marbled colour depending on the ripeness and growing conditions.



Yellow Candystripe

Fruit weight: 80g

Yellow Candystripe is the smallest but the most productive of our new beef tomatoes. The variety is medium early, has medium vigour and bright yellow, round, slightly ribbed fruits. The taste is pleasantly spicy and mild.



Oaxacan Jewel

Fruit weight: 180g

Oaxacan Jewel is the earliest of our beef tomatoes. The variety is less vigorous but productive, with a good, pleasant mild taste. The variety is potato-leaved, the fruits ripen from yellow to orange to red.

Extraordinary Rarities

Three truly extraordinary rarities! These gorgeous varieties are a hit at the farmers' market, add a touch of fancy to an elegant meal, and will no doubt find themselves being admired by the neighbours across the garden fence. All three varieties were bred and registered as EU amateur varieties by us.



Stuffing Tomato **Striped Cavern**

Fruit weight: 115g

What makes these lovely, square fruit special is that they are practically hollow inside! Cut open the top of the mottled red-yellow fruit, scoop out the seeds, and fill it up with something delicious. Plants are very healthy with a vigorous growth habit. Great yields make them suitable for the market garden, too.



True Black! **Indigo Rose**

Fruit weight: 50g

Salad tomato with a slightly spicy aroma. Fruit turn a spectacular black early on in their growth, with an added dark purple blush upon ripening. High anthocyanin content. Good yields at late ripening. Average growth habit. Avoid exceedingly high temperatures!



Travelling Tomato **Voyage**

Fruit weight: 100g

A bright red tomato with good flavour and an astounding fruit habit. Small individual fruits are fused together into one big cluster that can be picked apart bit by bit. This tomato is the perfect companion for a trip or picnic. No need for knives or napkins! The "Travelling Tomato" is a great showpiece for garden and market! Plants have a vigorous growth habit and high yield potential.

Basilikum

(Ocimum basilicum)

...and basil goes well with it

For three years, we explored the question of the right basil variety for companion planting with our tomatoes, conducting extensive trials with various basil types. Besides a good aroma and flavour, we also considered attractiveness to insects, yield, tendency to bolt (go to seed prematurely), and re-growth after cutting.

The varieties were selected for outdoor cultivation without fertilizer or additional irrigation, making them robust and a 'must-have' in any garden – whether as a flowering bee meadow, an aromatic herb, or for pesto production. Contrary to the usual practice of sowing many seeds in one pot, we recommend using only 2-3 basil seeds per planting hole, as this allows for significantly stronger and more robust plants to develop.



Red Basil **Rosara**

Vigorous but relatively sparsely leafed basil with medium-sized leaves and moderate bolting resistance. The variety is also suitable for dehydrating/drying, as well as fresh processing. The attractive red leaves add striking notes to the garden and on the plate. If left unharvested, some plants will bloom for several months, attracting a variety of insects from butterflies to bees to hoverflies. The variety remains productive and healthy until late autumn.



Basil **Sonja**

Classic Genovese type with small leaves and very good yield. With sufficient water supply, the variety forms sprawling, lush plants with correspondingly high yields and good taste. Just a few plants can provide sufficient quantities for pesto and salad.





Basil **Giulia**

Giulia is a very compact, juicy, crunchy 'lettuce-leaved' basil. The variety particularly impressed with its very good flavour and above-average bolting resistance. The juicy green leaves are very large and heavily curled. Due to its compact growth, this variety almost resembles a small lettuce and is well-suited for container growing.



Basil **Alessandro**

Very good, classic Genovese variety, for cutting use, in outdoor cultivation. The variety is also quite bolt resistant, high-yielding and has a good and balanced flavour. The leaf health is above average and the deep, dark green leaves are very appealing. In our view this variety stood out due to its good late summer and autumn yields.

(Capsicum annuum)

After further trials, we are expanding our pepper range by introducing three more varieties, which also have excellent suitability for growing outdoors. With the new varieties, we want to expand both the range of tastes and uses, as well as the harvest period.



Sweet Pepper **Roter Augsburg**

Pointed, glowing, sweet red fruit.

Can be grown under cover in a greenhouse or outdoors.

Sweet Pepper **Sweet Chocolate**

Sweet Chocolate boasts a mild flavour and ripens early in the season. Its beautiful colouring goes from dark green to rich chocolate when ripe. Fruit are elongated to blocky with a fruit weight of about 150g. This pepper does well outdoors. Plants are compact and therefore suitable for growing in pots or containers.

Sweet Pepper **Sweet Banana**

Sweet Banana is a mild-flavoured, high-yielding sweet pepper that thrives outdoors. Its intense peppery flavour ranges from pleasantly fresh to fruity. Elongated fruit are up to 20cm long and 5cm across and transition from yellow to red as they ripen.

Thanks to their slight curvature, the yellow fruit are reminiscent of bananas. These peppers are delicious harvested yellow or red and can be enjoyed raw, cooked, fried, grilled or filled.

The following two varieties were developed by pioneer of biodynamic breeding Dr Hartmut Spieß at Dottenfelder Hof and registered in 2024. After trials in 2023 and 2024, we were won over and are now happy to be able to offer them to you.



Sweet Pepper **Shirina**

The “tomato pepper” Shirina is a variety specifically bred for outdoor growing with blocky fruits that ripen red to dark red. The plants are medium-tall in their habit (approx. 80cm) and bear well-developed, sweet, aromatic and pleasingly thick-fleshed fruits.

The fruit begins to ripen in July and continues until late autumn, resulting in many fruits per plant. The fruits are large – on average around 120g. Despite the heavy fruits, the variety stands firm but needs to be supported to achieve full yield. The peppers, which can also be enjoyed green, are suitable for fresh use as well as for making preserves and powders.

Sweet Pepper **Djagila**

The outdoor-grown pepper Djagila produces fruits that start yellow and ripen to red, with a pointed shape. The plants are of medium height (about 80cm) and bear well-developed, sweet, thick-fleshed, and aromatic fruits. After the first harvest, the plants continue to produce, allowing for a steady harvest of peppers until November.

The fruits are large, with an average length of around 20 to 25 cm and a weight of approximately 130g. The yellow peppers begin to ripen in July, and the red peppers can be harvested from August onwards. The harvest window extends into November. These peppers are suitable for both fresh consumption and for making preserves and powders.



Djagila has also been placed under the Open-Source Seed License, joining our growing collection of licensed varieties, including the first tomatoes (Sunviva, Vivaroma, and Vivagrande) and the sweetcorn variety Lisanco. The goal is to protect seed as a commons. For more information about the Open-Source Seed License (OSSL), visit <https://opensourceeds.org/en>



Sweet Pepper **Yoshkosh**

Yoshkosh is by far our largest pepper to date. The variety is very productive in the greenhouse and outdoors, although it ripens a little later than our other varieties due to the size of its fruit. The taste is very sweet and aromatic. With appropriate fertilization and watering, the plants become very sprawling and due to the heavy fruit have to be supported from summer onwards.



Sweet Pepper **Madame Paraplü**

Madame Paraplü' emerged from a cooperation between Culinaris and Philipp Lammer in south-eastern Austria. The variety was bred as an ornamental and sweet pepper especially for balcony gardens. From early in the year the leaves show a decorative marbling. As they ripen, the fruits then provide a colourful firework display: initially green and white stripes, the small truncated conical fruits turn yellow and orange until they finally reach full maturity with red and brown stripes.

Hot Pepper **Poromeo** (Fresno)

Poromeo is an early-ripening, high-yielding hot pepper suitable for growing out of doors. The pointed fruit start out green and ripen to a beautiful dark red, reaching a length of about 7cm. This variety's highly aromatic fruit are given a hotness rating of 5, making them great for cooking, frying, filling or pickling. These peppers also do well dehydrated or dried in the oven and then ground to make a fantastic kitchen spice. Plants are compact and ideal for pots or containers. We recommend staking the plants for extra stability.





Chilli **Prairie Fire** (*Capsicum spec.*)

A fiery hot chilli pepper with great flavour and pleasant texture. Well suited for cooking or preserving. Real chilli lovers might even enjoy this one raw! Small, squat, and bushy plant, covered in upright fruit, which turn from matt-yellow to dark red as they ripen. Pleasing to the eye and highly productive, this plant does well in the garden, in a pot, or on the windowsill.



Chilli **Sipka Zitronen**

Sipka Zitronen is an extremely robust, highly productive and precocious outdoor chilli with bright yellow pointed fruits, about 7cm long. The fruits are quite hot (Hotness rating 6) and convince with their intense, exotic fruity aromas. Particularly suitable for drying to produce bright yellow chilli powder or for the special aroma when cooking curries. Suitable for growing in containers.



Chilli **Cayellow**

Cayellow is a dark yellow (almost orange) chilli with relatively large fruit and medium heat. The approximately 15 cm large and relatively thick-fleshed fruits ripen very early, even outdoors, and thus yield highly throughout the season. Overall, the plants are very healthy and visually appealing thanks to the contrast between the lush green and the bright yellow fruits. Due to the smooth skin and the rather smooth shape, the fruits can be processed quickly and easily.



Chilli **Cayorange**

The orange-fruited Cayorange is our earliest-ripening chilli and with its bright yellow-orange colour it brings a new colour dimension to the garden. The yield is very high due to the long harvest period, with a consistently good flavour/taste.

Aubergines

(Solanum melongena)

Like tomatoes and peppers, aubergines are also very diverse in terms of shapes, colours and taste. In 2011 we started to trial aubergines for unprotected and extensive outdoor cultivation at Culinaris. In 2016 and 2017 we extended our trials with encouraging results!

We see great potential for growing aubergines in Germany. Many varieties are coping extremely well with the recent dry and hot summers and are increasingly producing reliable and high yields. In addition to the tried and tested varieties Benary's Blaukönigin and Slim Jim, we have added two other varieties to our range. The heritage varieties Applegreen and Tschechische Frühe (Czech Early) won us over in the 2020 trials. We recommend growing varieties together for an extended season!



Aubergine **Benary's Blaukönigin**

Blaukönigin is one of the earliest aubergine varieties and surprises in July with a lush and prolonged harvest.

The variety is ideal for outdoor cultivation, but can also be grown in containers and on the balcony. The compact, rather small variety (heights around 60cm) brings reliable yields even outside the wine-growing regions and convinces with its medium-sized (about 150g) purple fruits and good plant health.

The taste is pleasantly intense, but not bitter. The fruits cook and fry wonderfully. Overall, the variety is very undemanding, requires no support or intensive fertilization and is therefore ideal for the home garden.



Aubergine **Slim Jim**

Slim Jim performs well under extensive conditions with high yields from midsummer.

The upright, lush leafy variety has numerous elongated purple fruits that grow in clusters. The fruits reach sizes of approx. 15 cm and have an average weight of approx. 100 g. Slim Jim has an excellent intense aubergine taste and is not bitter. The maturity is medium late with a prolonged harvest period.

In addition to the fruit, the leaves are also purple, which makes Slim Jim a real eye-catcher. The variety is very healthy and, in addition to being grown outdoors, can also do well in containers or on the balcony.



Aubergine **Applegreen**

This aubergine, which is also ideal for outdoor use, is actually harvested completely green and has a pleasantly fleshy, classical aubergine flavour.

The aubergines are larger than normal for outdoor cultivation, with fruit weights of up to 300g. The plants stay healthy for a long time and thus achieve abundant yields.

The plants have very large, light green leaves and are practically resistant to attack by Colorado beetles.

Aubergine **Rezeina** (Tschechische Frühe - Czech early)

An old variety with relatively large fruit (up to 15cm) in relation to the size of the plant, in classic purple. As the name would suggest it ripens very early, has a high yield and brings reliable yields even in cooler locations. Rezeina has a very nice compact form with multiple stems.

Melons

(Citrullus lanatus & Cucumis melo)

As early as 2018, we carried out a comprehensive variety screening of over 100 melons potentially suitable for outdoor production of which we planted the best again in 2019. As always, we paid special attention to suitability under low-input conditions (without additional fertilization, irrigation, etc.).

Two watermelons and three honeydew melons performed particularly well, and we have bulked them up and are now offering them to you.

In the case of honeydew melons, we have not yet made a final decision as to whether we will keep all three varieties in the range and in maintenance breeding.



Watermelon **Blacktail Mountain**

With a fruit weight of up to 5 kg and a surprisingly quick ripening for outdoors, this watermelon emerged as the best variety by far from our variety selection. The variety copes extremely well with drought and heat, but is also forgiving of the recurring cold nights in May and June - which enables an almost reliable harvest to be achieved.

Since the plants have relatively sparse foliage, we recommend growing through a mulch.

Watermelon **Solopoly**

Solopoly is very suitable for growing outdoors, ideally through a mulch. It is robust and productive and the fruits are very sweet and tasty, even in less sunny years!

The weight of the oval, elongated fruits varies from 2 to 4 kg. The skin is smooth with a beautiful light to dark green grain. The flesh is a light yellow to strong golden colour and smells intensely when fully ripe.





Honeydew Melon **Frusito** (M01)

Very tasty, aromatic honeydew melon with small (approx. 12 cm) oval-shaped fruits weighing around 800g. The melons are yellowish on the outside with green stripes, slightly ribbed and a bit hairy. The flesh is light to dark green depending on ripeness. A little later than the other two melons.



Honeydew Melon **Amelia** (Oka du Quebec)

Early ripening and also very tasty honeydew melon with green, relatively strongly ribbed skin and orange-coloured flesh. The variety has a very high yield potential with an average fruit size and weight slightly over 1 kg.



Honeydew Melon **Cantaloup** Charentais

This vigorous melon has a fruit size of around 800g and lies between Frusito and Amelia. It emerged from our selection as a taste favourite and impresses with its very sweet and aromatic fruits, with a slightly lower yield than the others. The skin is noticeably thin and striped yellow-green.

Physalis & Tomatillo

(*Physalis spec.*)

These Physalis varieties offer a remarkable diversity and suitability for different climatic conditions and purposes. Annual varieties are particularly well-suited for mid-latitudes, since they don't require elaborate efforts to overwinter and reward the gardener with scores of delicious fruit in their very first year. Taste ranges from hearty, tart tomatillos best used for cooking, to sweet, exotic-tasting Physalis with smaller fruit perfect for snacking straight from the plant. Between 2014 and 2015 we completed a successful search for Physalis that do well grown outdoors under low-input conditions.



Large-fruited Physalis **Tropicana** (Pa 1517-033)
(*Physalis peruviana*)

In addition to excellent plant health, Tropicana impresses with the excellent sweet-sour and sensationally aromatic taste of its exotic yellow-orange-coloured fruits (Brix degree over 15%!). The fruits are storable and can still be harvested after the first light frosts, making them a good source of vitamins late in the year. The plants should be grown with very low fertilization and irrigation levels.



Physalis **Dulceria**
(*Physalis pruinosa*)

A diminutive physalis with an exotic, fruity flavour. This variety produces an abundance of small yellow fruit that drop with ripeness and store well. Bushy, dark-green plants are healthy and compact, making them well-suited for growing in pots or planters. Starting seeds in March is recommended, since germination and early plant development can be slow. Pricking out seedlings is preferable to seeding individual seeds. Harvest from June until first frost.



Tomatillo **Aurora**
(*Physalis ixocarpa*)

For a tomatillo, Aurora's yellow, mandarin-size fruit are exceptionally sweet. They make a splendid addition to sauces, are excellent pan-fried, and fully ripened make a great raw snack. Classic salsa recipes call for these tomatillos and plenty of chilli peppers. Young plants are pretty with lush green foliage. First buds can appear prior to transplanting outside. Fruit ripens considerably earlier than most comparable varieties.

Cucumbers

(Cucumis sativus)

In 2017 and 2018 we trialled a wide range of cucumbers to select for unprotected field production. They had to cope without additional fertilization, with prolonged drought and sporadic heavy rainfall. Maintenance was kept to a minimum. The focus was on yield, low bitterness, taste, and leaf and fruit health.



Gundel (GU-7632)

Gundel is the ideal cucumber for extensive outdoor cultivation (intensive cultivation has not yet been tested). The variety also has a very good aromatic taste and produces a high yield over a long period. The leaf health is very good and even in extreme drought the fruits do not get bitter. The cucumber is ideal for salads and fresh consumption, but is also great in smoothies. The young plants are strong, the plants have a medium vigour.

Salad Cucumber Bodoana (GU-4401)

Bodoana is earlier than Gundel and can therefore extend the harvest period, but in dry weather without irrigation, the harvest ends earlier. It is also very healthy and copes extremely well with dryness and low fertilizer levels.

The fruits are longer and heavier and more closely resemble a classic "cucumber". The taste is very fresh and balanced.



Pot Cucumber Antje (Gu-3303)

We especially recommend Antje for anyone who wants to grow cucumbers in pots, raised beds or in short anywhere where space is at a premium.

The variety is high-yielding, tasty and not only grows outdoors, but also extremely well in containers! The cucumbers can be harvested as a snack or salad cucumber and have a long harvest period.





Cucumber **Salome** (Sikkimgurke aus Siebenbürgen)

The all-rounder among the cucumbers!

Problem-free growing outdoors; remains healthy and productive for a very long time.

The cucumbers can be harvested fresh and green for salads and, if harvested regularly, will continue to produce fresh, tasty cucumbers with a pronounced aroma for months - perhaps the tastiest cucumber we know.

If you can't keep up with the harvest, this is also no problem with this variety, as even the fully ripe cucumbers do not get bitter and can be used wonderfully as stewed cucumbers, in smoothies or peeled in salads. The cucumbers change colour from a bright green to yellow to brown and the skin becomes netted. The mature, brown-skinned cucumbers can be stored and stay juicy for a surprisingly long time. Since bitter substances can occur in the first 1-3 cm of cucumbers from the stem end due to stress (e.g. heat, drought), we recommend removing the stem as a preventative measure.

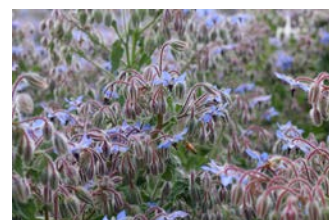

Since there isn't just one origin or variety of borage, we conducted a review in 2023 and can now offer the two most impressive varieties. We focused on traits such as suitability for cutting, yield, flavour, and attractiveness to insects. In this process, a white and a blue variety positively stood out. Both are now available for you to order from us.



Blue Borage Lena

A vigorous and high-yielding borage variety with bright blue flowers and an extended harvest period.

The entire plant can be consumed or used. Finely chopping it minimises the “scratchy” texture. Regular trimming encourages fresh green regrowth..



White Borage Martha

White-flowering borage is less common than its blue counterpart but no less appealing.

In our trials Martha stood out with a slightly longer harvest window, thanks to its slightly better plant health. The entire plant can be consumed or used. Finely chopping it minimises the “scratchy” texture.

Regular trimming promotes the regrowth of fresh greens.

Achocha *Cyclanthera*
(*Cyclanthera pedata*)

Cyclanthera is a strongly climbing *Cucurbit* suitable for greening wire mesh or facades with tensioned bands. Can grow over 2m high.

The fruits can be harvested at olive size for eating. Raw or pickled, they taste like small cucumbers, cooked they taste like asparagus.⁷ It can be grown in large containers and in pots.

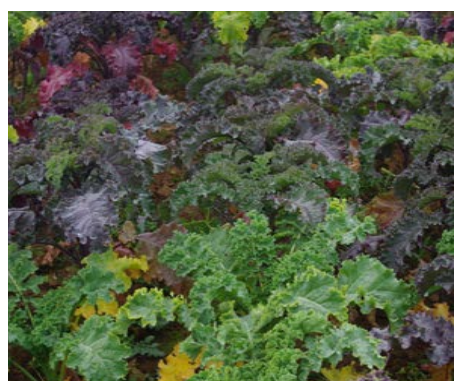

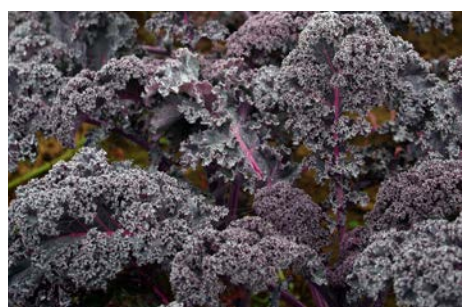

Mustard Greens Feathergreen
(*Brassica juncea*)

Light green, frilled leaves with a mild, mustardy spice. Makes a lovely addition to salads or vegetable stir-fries.

Harvest like Rocket. Somewhat winter hardy, though best suited for overwintering in an unheated greenhouse.

Can be grown in planters or pots on the balcony. Sowing dates: Feb.-Oct., or anytime if grown indoors.

Abyssinian cabbage (*Brassica carinata*) is a newcomer to Germany! Use it as a nutty, cabbage-like salad ingredient or harvest the young shoots as leaves for steaming. The taste is similar to broccoli.⁶

Tagetes

.....and it goes with everything!

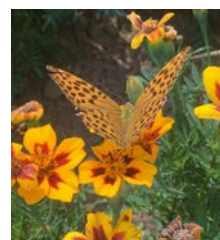
Tagetes keeps the soil healthy, provides nectar for insects, is easy to grow and looks beautiful too – in short: tagetes makes the gardener happy!

Tagetes should be present in every garden; and here too the selection of varieties is almost limitless. In our review, we limited ourselves to insect-friendly (i.e. single flowers) varieties. When selecting varieties, a long flowering period, easy insect access, and of course the look and the scent played a decisive role.



Colourful Tagetes Kolibri
(*Tagetes patula*)

Low to medium-height marigolds with a very long flowering period, and highly attractive to people and insects (appearance and scent). Kolibri (Hummingbird) develops quite quickly early in the season, producing lush green foliage, quickly covering the ground. The flowers vary from light yellow to dark red, with various colour gradients within the flowers. Due to its compact growth, the variety is also well suited as an understorey or for mixed cultures, especially with crops susceptible to nematodes, and of course as a container plant..



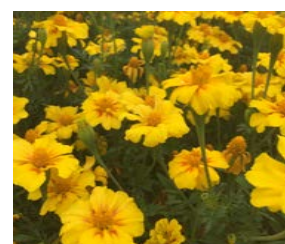
Colourful Tagetes Nova
(*Tagetes patula*)

Nova is a tall and sprawling marigold mix with an enormously wide range of colours and shapes when flowering. Due to the lush biomass produced, the mixture is also very well suited for soil recovery and preparation, and also makes a wonderful addition to vegetable mixed beds and perennial beds. It flowers a little later than Kolibri.



Orange-flowered Tagetes Aurelia
(*Tagetes tenuifolia*)

Aurelia is a small-flowered 'cushioned marigold', which, thanks to its filigree growth, is wonderfully suited to overhangs (walls, raised beds, etc.), in pots, but also to completely cover the ground in the bed. The fragrant flowers are light orange with a dark orange centre.



Yellow-flowered Tagetes Lumo
(*Tagetes patula*)

Lumo is a medium-tall variety with bright yellow-orange flowers with a red spot in the centre. The attractive buds stretch skyward, making them easy to prune. The flowering period begins very early and lasts until the frosts. A great strain for adding a splash of yellow colour to the garden.

Lettuce

Spring and Winter Lettuce; Butterhead (*Lactuca sativa*)

Winter salad usually means endives, lamb's lettuce (corn salad), and sugar loaf chicory – we invite you to try something a little different this season: extraordinarily tasty head lettuces, planted in autumn and overwintered for an early spring harvest.

Young headed lettuce is a lot hardier than you'd think. Until about fifty years ago, when overwintering lettuce was par for the course, home and market gardeners alike profited from getting a head start on their growing season with these early lettuces. From a broad selection of varieties, we chose two of the most unique and interesting ones for our field trials. Even though the grocery stores have greatly improved their assortment of greens over the past ten years, there is one thing they forgot: the very best salads are harvested at home!

Humil

(*Lactuca sativa* var. capitata)

A real old-fashioned butterhead lettuce. Medium-sized, bright green heads with few outer leaves that need removing before eating. Heads have a creamy heart and dense, beautifully filled hearts. Overall pronounced buttery qualities are a pleasant surprise for most gardeners!



Roter Butterhäuptl (Red Butterhead)

(*Lactuca sativa* var. capitata)

A small red head lettuce that weighs about 200 grams. Early harvest means early colour on your plate! Can be planted quite close together: 25 x 25 cm and tighter.

Our suggestion: plant at half distances and harvest every second lettuce as loose-leaf rather than head lettuce.



These lettuces are only suitable for early outdoor and over-winter production. For over-winter cultivation: Direct sow at the end of August or plant in mid-October. The top edge of the block/module should be flush with the ground. The lettuces should overwinter with around 8 real leaves. Snow is the best winter protection. Only hard frosts are dangerous. If necessary, protect with fleece or straw (as late as possible - after Christmas).

Spargelsalat (Asparagus Lettuce)
(*Lactuca sativa* var. *angustana*)

Lettuce of a different kind!

The focus here is on the fleshy, tasty stem.

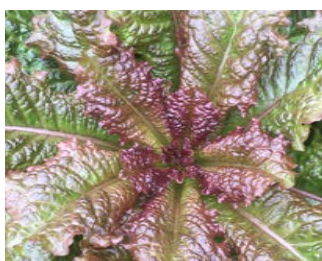
Harvested before buds form, celtuce is peeled and eaten raw or cooked just like asparagus or kohlrabi.

Plants need plenty of space to grow, at least 30 x 30 cm, and some attention until they reach optimal size. Will form small rosettes that can be harvested and eaten like regular lettuce.



Loose-Leaf/Cutting Lettuce Salad Bowl
(*Lactuca sativa* var. *crispa*)

Salad Bowl is a fantastic long-season oak-leaf lettuce that is slow to bolt. Planted for harvesting as heads, individual plants will form large rosettes. Leaves are tender and mild and will regrow two or three weeks after cutting.



Loose-Leaf/Cutting Lettuce Redbone
(*Lactuca sativa* var. *crispa*)

Redbone is a great loose-leaf/cutting variety! Leaves are shiny red and plants are late to bolt. This variety rewards us with a high and continuous yield when harvested as loose-leaf rather than head lettuce, making it great for the balcony, backyard and raised bed. Plant like head lettuce.

Lamb's Lettuce Verte de Cambrai
(*Valerianella locusta*)

Verte de Cambrai lamb's lettuce is a classic variety, with thick leaves and a rosette-shaped growth habit. It is used in salads, for example with a dressing of cream, lemon, and a little sugar. This variety is winter-hardy, undemanding, and fast-growing.

Zuckermais & Popcorn

(*Zea mays*)

Sweetcorn for a variety of tastes.

We recommend sowing several batches to enjoy crisp corn well into autumn. The ears of corn from each batch will ripen at roughly the same time and should be eaten promptly.



Sweetcorn **Golden Bantam**

Heritage, open-pollinated variety with shapely ears. Perfectly delicious for cooking, grilling, roasting, or eating raw. This robust variety is slightly less sweet compared to some newer cultivars, which is typical of traditional varieties.



Sweetcorn **Lisanco**



Lisanco is the first open source sweetcorn! And delicious! Those who like sweetcorn will love Lisanco. The variety is healthy, stable and produces large, crunchy cobs that are suitable for any use. We recommend sowing successionaly to eat fresh corn until autumn. The variety was bred by Hartmut Spieß at Dottenfelder Hof in Germany.

In 2014 and 2015 we trialed a wide selection of popcorn varieties. The diversity, especially of kernel colour and form, but also of growth habit, was astounding! When making our selections, we paid special attention to superior taste and plant health while keeping an eye out for extraordinarily beautiful cobs! A silvery-black variety which we call NegroCine was registered in 2016/2017. In 2018 we also registered Bear Paw.



Popcorn **NegroCine**

A dwarf (1 – 1.20m) variety with a nutty, aromatic flavour. The plants and cobs are easy on the eye and the kernels pop beautifully! Kernels vary in colour from dark blue to greyish-black and have a silvery shimmer. Individual plants send out plenty of side shoots and often yield five or more 10cm-long cobs. Plants are healthy and robust. NegroCine makes a pretty popcorn; drying cobs also make a great decoration at home, in the shop or

at the market stand. We recommend an early greenhouse start in April, particularly in northern latitudes, as full ripening when direct-sown may be hampered by cooler summers.



Ornamental Corn, Popcorn **Erdbeermais**
(Strawberry Corn)
(*Zea mays japonica*)



Erdbeermais -Strawberry corn - is distinguished by its vibrant red cobs, which resemble strawberries in shape and colour. As well as being decorative, the kernels can be used to make delicious popcorn. The plants are relatively short but tiller vigorously, allowing for a large harvest of cobs from a single plant. Strawberry corn matures relatively early, making it possible to harvest ripe cobs even in cooler climates.



Popcorn **Bear Paw**

Bear Paw is a dwarf popcorn variety (1m – 1.60m) with great flavour, exceptional appearance and very early ripening. Cobs are white and, when well pollinated, tend to split apart into multiple “paws”. Cobs reach a length of about 15cm. Plants are healthy and strong.

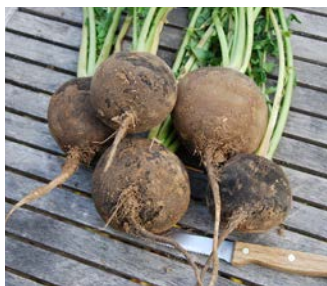
We recommend starting this variety indoors in April, especially in northern regions with short growing seasons.

Radish **Runder Schwarzer Winter**
(Round Black Winter)
(*Raphanus sativus* var. *niger*)

A gorgeous white-fleshed radish with black skin, this variety grows to about fist-size and stores well for the whole winter.



Radish **Green Luobo**
(*Raphanus sativus* var. *niger*)

Green Luobo is characterised by its approx. 15cm narrow, elongated, mostly green-coloured roots that only grow slightly into the soil. The foliage is strong, dark green and has a glossy shimmer. The roots are white-fleshed, slightly green in colour in the upper area. The taste is pleasantly mild, crunchy and extremely buttery. The roots store very well. Also suitable for cultivation over the summer.

Salsify **Sandwich Island**
(*Tragopogon porrifolium*)

Excellent, slightly sweet aroma reminiscent of creamy porridge oats. These are regarded as a delicacy in the United Kingdom, where they are known as “oyster plant”. Grow them like their relative, scorzonera. Harvest begins in September and lasts until the following spring. Left unharvested, plants will set lovely, purple flowers in their second year.



Our **parsnips** are ideal for making soups, vegetables or salads; do not peel, just brush off. Caution: contact with green parts of plants can cause phototoxic skin reactions (see giant hogweed).



Parsnip **White King**
(*Pastinaca sativa*)

A short, fat, mid-sized, tapered parsnip for easy cultivation and harvest on level soils. Strong, aromatic flavour.





Parsnip Aromata
(*Pastinaca sativa*)

The Aromata parsnip has slender, buttery-white roots and is specially bred for outstanding flavour: it is aromatic and fruity, lacking any sharp or bitter notes. Its smooth fine-grained texture also makes it ideal for eating raw – for example, finely grated in salads. By far the most delicious parsnip variety we know!

Radish Grazer Treib
(*Raphanus sativus* var. *sativus*)



The Grazer Treib radish stands out from many standard varieties due to its exceptionally large roots. Its light-pink skin makes it visually appealing, and it impresses with its pleasant spiciness and fresh, robust flavour. Conservation breeding and variety support are provided in cooperation with ARCHE NOAH⁴.

Miscellaneous

The following pages contain a colorful assortment of various cultivated plants that provide further inspiration for garden and balcony cultivation.



Dwarf French Beans **Beckers Wachsgelb** (Becker's Yellow Wax bean)
(*Phaseolus vulgaris* var. *nanus*)

Beckers Wachsgelb (Dr. Becker Nr. 18) is a stringless, vigorous bush bean with golden-yellow, tender pods and a good yield. It was bred by Dr. Becker in East Frisia. The pods do not ripen at the same time and require regular harvesting. Frequent harvesting and gentle picking extend the harvest period. Ridging the plants is recommended to increase their stability and nutrient uptake.



Okra **Silver Queen**

After several years of intensive selection, we can now recommend this variety for outdoor growing! The variety is vigorous and can reach plant heights of over 1 m, but in the open field it usually remains smaller. Thanks to its long taproot, it copes well with drought and has no problem with heat and strong sunlight. The fruits are best harvested young, and can be fried, boiled, used in stews and much more besides. Thanks to unusual leaves, strong, upright growth and bright flowers, the vegetable is also visually rewarding to grow!



Okra **Santa Cruz**

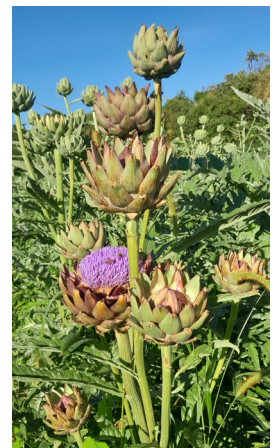
Also well suited for outdoor cultivation, but if available, growing in a greenhouse is also worthwhile - the plants become significantly more lush and produce significantly higher yields than in the open field. The fruits are darker than those of the Silver Queen. To find the right variety for your location, we recommend growing both..



Artichoke **Vert de Provence**

It is not without reason that Vert de Provence is a widespread artichoke variety with a relatively good over-wintering survival rate (even in Germany/Central Europe). If planted early in spring it can produce significant yields in its first year, which makes it particularly attractive for our climate. The plants are

healthy and extremely vigorous, which is reflected in the strong dark green leaf colour and the lush buds (the actual crop). If you don't harvest the buds as a vegetable, or don't harvest them completely, they produce impressive flower heads (up to 15cm!) that attract numerous insects.

Kohl Rabi Superschmelz/Gigant
(*Brassica oleracea* var. *gongylodes*)

As the name suggest, this variety reaches an enormous size. Can be harvested over the course of several weeks. The base becomes woody, but even the biggest specimens stay tender and juicy inside. After autumn harvest, they can be stored in the cellar until the spring. Requires twice as much space as regular kohlrabi in the garden.



Celery Schnittsellerie (Leaf Celery)
(*Apium graveolens* var. *secalinum*)

This aromatic leaf celery is a tasty variety that can be grown and used much like regular celery but is lower maintenance, less disease-prone and needs less space than its counterparts. Beginning in the springtime, leaves can be harvested as a leaf vegetable or for flavouring soups. Leaf celery also does exceptionally well dried or frozen. Fairly frost tolerant.



Welsh Onion Winzwyadne
(*Allium fistulosum*)

The Welsh onion is perennial and hardy, so it can be harvested as a permanent crop over many years. The leaves can be used like chives or as spicy leafy vegetables and the tender onions like spring onions. Historically, the Welsh onion was used as a spring onion. Their purple inflorescences are eye-catching in the vegetable garden and can be used in salads and as a garnish. It shoots in early spring and brings early harvests when most other crops are still a long way off.

Coriander Arata

In variety trials in 2021 this coriander emerged as the favourite. The variety has vigorous growth and can be cultivated almost all year. With regular harvesting/cutting, fresh green growth occurs several times. However, if not cut, you are rewarded first



with fragrant flowers that are very popular with insects and later with seeds for the spice rack. Arata means “freshness” in Japanese and that is exactly what we associate with this coriander. In salads, stews or even in herb quark, this coriander enriches (almost) every meal (provided you like coriander!). The variety can also be precision drilled, which means it can be grown particularly early and saves on seed use.



Lovage Maggikraut
(*Levisticum officinale*)

Lovage is a robust herb for hearty dishes, but in moderation, it can also be used wonderfully in salads and smoothies. This perennial plant, which can grow up to 2 metres high, is also a beautiful addition to any garden.



Chives Bellarisa
(*Allium schoenoprasum*)

Fine-tubed, enduring variety with fresh green from early spring to late autumn. Also well suited for balcony boxes, raised beds and flower beds.



Sorrel Belleville
(*Rumex rugosus*)

Sorrel Belleville is a large-leaved, perennial variety. It can be used fresh in salads or steamed in butter. Sorrel is also ideal for soups. It increases the body's defenses and has a blood-purifying and detoxifying effect. The leaves are often used for feeding small animals.



Löffelkraut (Scurvy Grass)
(*Cochlearia officinalis*)

Scurvy Grass was already known to the Vikings as a source of vitamin C for winter. The dark green leaves are harvested from summer to spring. They are used as a herb for salads and cooked dishes. The taste is reminiscent of horseradish and mustard. Scurvy Grass grows 25-50 cm high and over-winters if sown in autumn.

Further Flowers

...because food isn't just what ends up in our stomachs – our other senses need feeding too. Insects and other animals should also have a place. And several of the following flowers are indeed exactly that: edible.



Nasturtium multi-flowered, trailing
(*Tropaeolum majus*)



The multi-flowered nasturtium is as versatile as it is easy to grow. Whether you use the sweet blossoms or the slightly peppery, cress-like leaves, it's always delicious. The attractive flowers not only delight the eye but are also a favoured by insects. If the flowers aren't harvested, the buds and unripe seeds can later be pickled in brine or vinegar and used like capers in winter.



Red Sunflower
(*Helianthus annuus*)



The red sunflower is a profusely flowering, well-branched variety that can grow over 2 metres tall. It displays a beautiful mix of red shades, with blossoms showing colour transitions from dark yellow and reddish-orange to deep red. The plants produce fresh blooms over an extended period, and in late summer and autumn, the ripe seeds provide food for birds.

Prachtwinde (Morning Glory)
(*Ipomea purpurea*)

Stunning, trumpet-shaped flowers in deep blue, blush pink, and coral emerge from lush foliage.

Vines grow up to 5 meters in a season, and will climb fences, posts, or teepees.

Better suited to our climate than most other varieties of Morning Glory. Can also be grown in a planter or on the balcony.





Jungfer im Grünen (Oxford Blue) (Love in a Mist)
(*Nigella damascena*)

The plants of “Love in a mist” are delicate, filigree and grow to about 50cm high. They bloom in a play of colours from white to light-blue to dark blue-purple. Their flowers are really impressive and are very attractive to insects!



Marokkanisches Leinkraut
(Moroccan Toadflax)
(*Linaria maroccana*)

The flowers of this exquisite member of the plantain family are like tiny snapdragons. Low-maintenance, annual plants are diminutive, reaching about 30-50 cm. Flowers range from rosy-red to violet-blue, and last until the first hard frost. Plant in clumps to add dashes of colour to flower beds, or grow them in planters or window boxes.



Foxtail Millet Herbstfeuer (Autumn Fire)
(*Setaria italica*)

A traditional plant for added variety in your garden! Awnless seedheads ripen to red-brown along with leaves, resulting in highly decorative plants. Ideal for dried flower arrangements or birdseed. Can be grown in pots or planters.



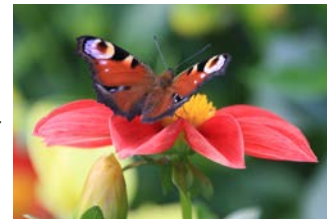
Verbena (*Verbena bonariensis*)

Perennial Verbena reaches a height of 80 to 150cm and sports flowers in clusters of long-lasting blue-violet umbels. Flowers last from about July until as late as October. Cold winters can kill the plant, making Verbena winter hardy only to a degree. This beautiful, waifish plant is a special treat for bees.



Dahlia (*Dahlia variabilis*)

A dwarf variety that reaches a height of about 50 cm. Unfilled blossoms come in a range of colours and flower in the first year. Will overwinter. Start them early to extend the flowering season. Dahlias do very well in pots or planters. Thanks to the unfilled flowers, our dahlia is an absolute magnet for insects!
